Dear People of Grace,

Happy New Year! I have a project for us to participate in this year as we read the Gospels and particularly as we hear the words of our Lord Jesus in the Gospels. I got this idea from a friend who sent me a posting from the *Huffington Post* blog. I would encourage you to read the entire posting at <http://m.huffpost.com/us/entry/6343320?ncid=txtlnkusaolp00000592>.

The article was written by Brandon

Robertson and it really caught my interest. It is entitled "4 Teachings of Jesus that His Followers (Almost) Never Take Seriously". The premise of the article is that we, as followers of Jesus, choose to blatantly ignore some of the clearest instruction of Jesus and obscure it with vague theology so that we can get off the hook. Other times,

Robertson says, followers of Jesus are taught something explicitly contradictory to the plain words of Jesus and then spend their lives obeying the instruction they received instead of the commands of Jesus. Robertson discovered this when he took time to re-read the Gospels of the New Testament and get reacquainted with Jesus himself, in his own words. He writes, "As I studied the words of Jesus, I discovered that so much of what he asks of us as his disciples is incredibly clear and yet so much of it was new to me. I have never heard it in church or Sunday School or actually heard someone teach the exact opposite of the words of Christ. It was during that season of my life where I took inventory of how I lived and what I believed and aligned to the person and teachings of Christ that my faith was radically transformed for the better."

Let's look at one of Robertson's

examples of teachings that Jesus' followers almost never take seriously. Robertson maintains, "Jesus, not the Bible, is God's living and active Word that brings life." He cites the following quote in support of this idea. "You don't have His word living in you, because you don't believe the one He sent. You search the scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that testify on my behalf. Yet you refuse to come to me to have life"

(John 5:39-40 NRSV).

The point that Roberts makes from this is that it is Jesus, alive and active in our lives on a day to day basis, that assists us in cultivating an intimate relationship with Him. Yet, we often try to root our faith in the Bible rather than in the person of Jesus, as

did (according to Him) some of his first century followers. Robertson suggests that we pursue an active relationship directly with Christ and that the Spirit of God within us, informed by Scripture, will help us draw close to Jesus, which is the point of being his follower. Jesus, not the Bible, is the foundation or center of our faith. And if we truly believe that He is alive, we should also have faith that communing with Him will produce spiritual life within us.

That said, I would invite you to join me this year in listening directly to our Lord Jesus afresh. "May we be open to hear directly from you, Lord Christ, and may we obey you in all things."

# Budget Update

Pledge receipts of \$32,014 in October brought year-to-date pledges to \$326,869 compared to budgeted pledges of \$329,086. Considering all other income sources, income for the first eleven months totaled \$410,534 resulting in a negative variance of (\$6,017).

The negative income variance for the first eleven months was offset by under-budget Program costs of \$339, under-budget Operations costs of \$7,102 and under-budget Personnel costs of \$13,247. These positive variances total \$20,688, but this number is reduced somewhat by over-budget expenses of \$564 in Outreach giving us total savings from budgeted expenses of \$20,124. When applied to the negative income variance of (\$6,017) and adjusted for suspended costs of \$480, year-to-date income less expenses at the end of November totaled \$13,627. We are prayerful that all needs will be met with continued offerings.
