Dear People of Grace,

WE NEED YOUR HELP. I am going to ask you to help the Vestry and me raise the money for next year's budget. Yes, I know we do this every year. But, unlike the usual way — appointing a Chairman and/or a committee to make sure it happens and is successful — this year, I am going to ask all of us to take on that responsibility.

We are going to have three weeks — the second, third and fourth Sundays of October — during which we will think together about giving to God as a spiritual practice. First, we will take a close look at why we get so nervous and fearful about money and not having enough. Then, we are going to think together about how God can help us with those fears.

Next, we will define giving as a spiritual practice. What this means is that our regular giving to God becomes the same as our other spiritual practices — worship, study, reflection, prayer and serving God in our lives. Like these other spiritual practices, the spiritual practice of giving draws us closer to God, helps us feel good about doing our part financially to further God's purposes through Grace Church and helps set us free from the consumerism and the lies the world perpetrates about money. Consider how much advertising we see that equates money with happiness. Yet as Christ's followers, we know in our hearts that this is not so. As a wise person once said, "Money is a great servant but a poor master."

On the third week, we will think together about actually making the spiritual practice of giving into a real practice in our lives. We will consider how to carry it out in such a way that it not only fuels the ministry of Grace, but

also instills in us a profound sense of wellbeing as we try to put God first in the financial arena of our lives.

In these three weeks, all the emphasis is going to be on encouraging every member at Grace to consider making a financial pledge to God through Grace as part of his or her

spiritual practice. A visual aid in the foyer will track *the number of pledges only*. We believe the total amount of dollars will take care of itself. Again, the emphasis is going to be on asking our members to make a pledge to Grace as part of their spiritual practice of giving to God. With our number of pledges at 138 for this year, our goal will be 151, a 10% increase, for 2015.

Now, what I need from each of you is a commitment to either be a part of the thinking

together each week in church during worship, OR, if you cannot be there on one or more of the Sundays, to read and think about the emails which will be sent out on the Mondays after each of those three Sundays. On those Mondays, all of us will receive a copy of the lay witness for that Sunday and a copy of the teaching and handout from me. If you don't do email, please ask us for a copy by mail.

My hope and belief is that this will be the most inclusive and spiritual approach to pledging we have had at Grace since I have been here. It feels good. And what energizes me most is that it is an approach to raising money that is really about helping each other grow spiritually.

Slow Third Quarter

In the absence of \$6,510 received this year for last year's pledges, year to date total income at the end of August would be \$16,700 under budget instead of \$10,190 under budget. Year to date pledges were \$9,048 under budget; non-pledged offerings were \$7,789 under budget and open offerings were \$1,499 under budget resulting in total income of \$292,756 for the first eight months with targeted total income of \$302,946.

Total expenses for the first eight months were \$277,639 with budgeted costs of \$302,946. This positive variance of \$25,307 is due to the timing of budgeted needs and will be more in line with budgeted costs as we near the end of the year. As we approach the last quarter of the year, it is our prayer all needs will be met with continued offerings.
